After the spectacular hockey tournament at the Olympic Games in Beijing last year, the six best women's teams in the world meet each other again at the Samsung Champions Trophy in Sydney, Australia.

It has been a while since Australia has hosted one of the FIH World Level events. Exactly six years ago, the Women's Champions Trophy was played in Sydney. In 2009, the FIH is back in Australia, one of the leading hockey countries in the world. Not only for the Samsung Champions Trophy, but also later this year for the ABN AMRO Champions Trophy men in Melbourne.



The Samsung Champions Trophy 2009 will be an exiting and interesting tournament, especially to see how the top hockey nations in the world transform their teams in the post-Olympic year. After the great hockey show in Beijing last year, all eyes are already on the 2010 BDO World Cup, to be played in Rosario, Argentina from 30 August – 12 September 2010. The Samsung Champions Trophy 2009 will be the first test for the elite teams of the world.

The Samsung Champions Trophy will feature six hockey giants. Olympic and World Champion Netherlands, Olympic silver medallist China, Olympic bronze medallist and Samsung Champions Trophy defending Champion Argentina, former Olympic Champion Germany, rising star England and host Australia will secure a high level tournament. All six participants will guarantee top hockey during the entire Samsung Champions Trophy and will thrill the fans present in the beautiful Sydney Olympic Park.

This guide, prepared by our partner Infostrada Sports and the FIH Communications Department, will give you a perfect overview of all statistical information you can imagine.

1.2 Origin of the tournament

A new chapter in the history of women's hockey was inaugurated when the Royal Dutch Hockey Association (KNHB) organised a Women's Hockey Tournament at the Wagener Stadium in Amstelveen in June 1987, at the same time as the 9th edition of the Men's Champions Trophy.

This event involved five of the top six ranked teams at the 1986 World Cup (in Amstelveen): Netherlands, Canada, New Zealand, Great Britain and Australia. The only leading country, at that time, not competing in Amstelveen was West Germany. The 1986 World Cup-silver medallist and 1984 Olympic-silver medallist did not accept the original invitation and was replaced by Korea (the host-country of the 1988 Olympics).

In April 1987 the Council of the FIH (International Hockey Federation) decided to recognise this tournament as the first Women's Champions Trophy. The Women's Champions Trophy is counterpart to the Men's Champions Trophy, which was established in 1978 by the FIH following a proposal from the Pakistan Hockey Federation, to promote international hockey.

Netherlands, at that time World Champions (1986), Olympic Champions (1984) and European Champions (1984), became the first ever winners of the Women's Champions Trophy. The Dutch team won all five of their matches, scoring 21 goals. Australia finished second and Korea were ranked third.

A brilliant, attacking midfielder for Argentina since her international debut against the Netherlands in the 1998 World Cup, Luciana Aymar claimed an incredible fourth FIH Player of the Year award in 2007 having previously won the coveted prize in 2001, 2004 and 2005. She lists Diego Maradona as an idol, but her pace, vision and superb ball control on the hockey pitch have led to her being universally acknowledged as 'La Maga' (the magician). Aymar's lists of trophy wins with Las Leonas is impressive - three consecutive Pan American Games titles, the 2001 Champions Trophy and the 2002 World Cup as well as an Olympic silver in 2000 and Champions Trophy runners-up medals in 2002 and 2007. She was named Player of the Tournament at the 2008 Champions Trophy as Argentina took home the crown. She was also part of the team that won the bronze medal at the 2008 Olympic Games. She plays for GEBA Buenos Aires and has also played club hockey for Rot-Weiss Köln in Germany and Real Club de Polo Spain.

Later that year she was part of the Hockeyroos team that won the 2003 Champions Trophy. Noted for her pace and high work ethic in front of goal, she was granted a lifelong dream when she was selected for the 2008 Olympic team. She crowned her personal success with a goal in the Hockeyroos' 6-1 demolition of Spain in the group stage. The exercise sports science graduate started playing hockey at age nine on the encouragement of her grandmother.

Baorong Fu is a cornerstone in attack for the Chinese national team and feared by defenders for her vision and scoring ability. After finishing an agonizing fourth at the 2004 Olympic Games, the dynamic forward helped China's home Olympic campaign reach the Olympic Final before succumbing to the Netherlands 2-0 to finish with silver. Known by her teammates as 'Da Bao' she first experienced international success at the 2002 Champions Trophy in Macau where China defeated Argentina 3-1 on penalty strokes in the final. Since then she has also helped China to silver at the 2003 and 2006 Champions Trophy tournaments. China's only representative picked to the 2006 FIH Team of The Year, she has also been shortlisted for FIH Player of the Year in 2002, 2003, 2004 and 2008.

Named captain of Great Britain in 2004, the defensive stalwart of both England and Great Britain sides had won over 130 caps for England and 60 for Great Britain by the time she was 28 years old. Shortlisted for the 2003 Player of the Year Award, she was named Great Britain Hockey Athlete of the Year in 2007. After making her debut for England and Great Britain in 1999 she has played at the 2000 and 2008 Olympic Games, the 2002 and 2006 Hockey World Cups as well as the 2002 and 2006 Commonwealth Games. Born in Withington, she holds a sports science degree from Brunel University and is engaged to the captain of the English men's hockey team Brett Garrard. Nicknamed 'Walshy' or 'Walshka,' she was struck in the throat by a deflected ball whilst training for a World Cup qualifying tournament in Rome, Italy in 2006 but recovered in time to take her place at the World Cup.

She became the fourth member of the Keller Dynasty to win an Olympic Games medal after the German national team secured gold at the 2004 Games in Athens. The 31-year-old forward was also instrumental in the national side's 2008 Olympic campaign however her quick thinking and impressive skills were not enough to lift the women's team which bowed out to Argentina in the bronze medal game. Making her international debut in 1994 and known as 'Taschi, ' she was named Player of the Year by the FIH in 1999. Born in Berlin, she plays domestically for Berlin Hockey Club. The family's list of accolades stretches back to her grandfather, Edwin, who won silver at the 1936 Olympic Games in Berlin. Her father Carsten won gold in 1972, her step-brother Andreas won silver in 1984 and 1988 before winning gold in 1992. Brother Florian won gold with the men's team in 2008.

A two-time FIH All Star, Janneke Schopman is an uncompromising defender who is a three-time Champions Trophy winner (2004, 2005 and 2007) with the Dutch women's team. She has also collected gold medals at two European Championships (2003 and 2005), one World Cup (2006) and a silver medal at the 2004 Olympic Games in Athens. She added to this glowing list of accomplishments in 2008, when she was part of the Dutch team that won the Olympic gold medal in Beijing after defeating hosts China 2-0 in the final. An engineer by trade, she debuted in 2001 against Malaysia and answers to the nickname of 'Jan-Jan'. Schopman plays for the HC Den Bosch club in 's-Hertogenbosch in the Netherlands and likes to relax by reading books. She had an operation on a shoulder injury late in 2004 but was back in action early the following year.
